## Enriching Child Care through professional development

**We improve the quality of child care.** For 30 years, CCRC has been improving the quality of child care by providing high quality professional development opportunities for child care educators across our 9 county region.

**We have a large reach in the child care provider community.** On average, CCRC provides education to over 1,200 child care teachers annually so that our community's children are ready for school.

## Engaging and Educating Families through resource and referral services

**We have the expertise.** CCRC has early education experts who walk families through their search for quality child care based on their needs. These experts also provide education about what "quality" is - what to look for/what questions to ask during their search.

**We have the data.** CCRC maintains the largest database (over 1200 child care programs) in our 9 county region. The database includes information about a variety of child care options including traditional child care programs, school age care, summer camps, overnight care and drop in care.

**We know our community's resources.** CCRC staff can provide families with information related to financial assistance/scholarships to help with the cost of child care or helping a family moving to town understand how our school system works.

## Enhancing Communities

**We are laying the foundation for generations to come.** Quality child care/early learning experiences are intrinsically linked to school preparedness. School preparedness is intrinsically linked to success throughout the schooling of the child and their future success as adults. Quality child care is the first step in creating thriving communities.

**We provide customized services for businesses.** We provide a personalized level of service to employees of businesses who chose to contract with CCRC. This service saves time for employees of these companies by giving the employees access to a Parent Specialist who works with them until they have made a decision about child care. Businesses also contract to have CCRC's Nanny Search Service for their employees. These contracting companies are provided with reports that give them information about the child care needs of their workforce.

**We analyze the supply of and demand for child care in our community.** CCRC provides an annual Child Care Supply and Demand report which contains information about the early care and education system in our community. All services are available in English and Spanish.
